Who we are

The Bevan Foundation was established in 2001 to support new ideas about social justice in Wales. The Foundation takes its name from Aneurin Bevan because of his commitment to tackling poverty and disadvantage but it is independent of any political party, organisation or line of thought.

How we run

The Foundation is a registered charity and company limited by guarantee, owned and accountable to its members, and managed by a board of 12 trustees.

It is funded by membership subscriptions, donations, project grants and income from conferences and publications.

The Foundation promotes new thinking and ideas through research and investigations, through publishing reports and articles, and through discussion and debate at conferences and seminars.

Our research and inquiries

We are committed to high quality research which is based on hard evidence, not journalism. Our findings are practical and robust, and will help to make a real difference to improving the quality of people's lives on the ground.

Research findings are published in our policy papers or occasional papers series. They are well regarded and highly influential, helping to shape UK, Wales and local policies.

In post-devolution Wales we need diversity of thinking, to reflect the range of values and concerns about society. The Bevan Foundation is distinctive because of:

- its values - the only think tank in Wales committed to social justice;
- its focus – the only think tank in Wales consistently concerned with eradicating poverty, tackling discrimination and disadvantage;
- its internationalist perspective – on Wales in Britain, Europe and the world;
- its origins – in the labour, trades union and community movements.
